ince 1988, Lions Clubs International has sponsored the annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest to encourage young people to express their perspectives on peace. Young people from around the globe continue to offer Lions their expressions of peace in the hope that one day the dream may come true. So every year, as many as 400,000 children aged 11 to 13 from around the world participate in the contest. Sponsored by local Lions clubs, the international competition reflects one of the key tenets of Lions - to create and foster a spirit of understanding among the peoples of the world. One international grand prize winner and 23 merit award winners are chosen each year for their unique and heartfelt visions of peace created from crayon, watercolor, pencil and in other graphic

media. All winners receive a cash prize and certificate. Grand prize winners have come from all over the world: Italy, Japan, Indonesia, Brazil, South Africa and the United States, just to name a few. Now, there is a possibility of a winner coming from Howick, New Zealand.

Congratulations to 12-year-old Mackenzie Alley from Somerville Intermediate School, sponsored by the Lions Club of Howick, who's poster (see below) was judged to be the Multiple District (202, national) winner. 
