

Notes from our Dinner Meeting, March 4, 2020





We were privileged this evening to have two senior Lions join us from our 202K District Cabinet. i.e. Lynda Halverson (Papakura Lions) & Ricky Singh (Pakuranga-Panmure Lions). These two steadfast Lions gave their time to present to us the development history, current organisational structure and specific mission of our 'parent association', Lions Clubs International (LCI). (Accompanied by a PowerPoint screening with PC on the PC - laptop). It was an enlightening address for our newer members and a welcome refresher for our longer-serving Lions.

Lions Lynda & Ricky took us from the days of Melvin Jones who, in 1917

created our organisation from a number of varying US mens associations, to form one forceful entity of individuals focused on serving the needy and improving communities. We were reminded of Lions Clubs International (LCI) milestone moments: e.g. creating our name (LIONS); Helen Keller's inspiring speech and (later) LCI's introduction of the White Cane for the blind, with blindness to become a major LCI service focus; being a privileged party to the signing of the UN

Charter; going international (Lions are now in more than 200 countries with 47000 clubs); including women into membership; the creation of LEOS, and our Foundation (LCIF). The role of LCIF was highlighted by our speakers with impressive examples; more...

The presentation was relaxed & interactive, with prompt cards distributed around the room to emphasise points being made. Lynda & Ricky also looked a little into the future by noting Lions' mission now trending toward enhancing our planet's environment and promoting a caring & more compassionate mankind. (The maintenance & retention of club membership is regarded as a core function of all modern Lions clubs, recognising the 'competitive community service' options provided by a

number of charitable organisations operating in our local neighbourhoods).

Our own Brian Stocking then gave a fine presentation of the history & achievements of our Howick Lions Club, with screen slides & added humour. Again, it was a good study for both newer & older members. (President Paul later placed Brian's address on our club website).



Jottings from our business meeting March 18, 2020





Because of the current COVID-19 virus pandemic the venue for all our meetings at Dannemora Gardens (Metlifecare) has become off-limits. Metlifecare (with more than 5000 residents) has cancelled all open days at its villages, suspended personal access to its restaurants & bar facilities and is asking external groups not to visit until further notice. We await advice from DMG regarding resuming our club meetings there.

Thanks to Rajiv for arranging this business meeting in the Monet Room at the Highland Park Community House; (Raj is a past treasurer for this entity). 17 of us squeezed in (in the friendliest manner of course) and there were lots of laughs during the meeting. Despite the current virus disorder it was a cheerful Lions get-together.

President Paul clarified the (Govt.) health conditions under which we were gathering this evening, with the opportunity for anyone to leave if they felt they didn't meet the new, strict meeting criteria. No one left.

During the evening there was frequent reference to the possible impact of COVID-19 on the various projects under discussion. A consensus of those present agreed to forego all physical Howick Lions Club meetings until further notice. President Paul will plan to maintain Lions business online via a video conferencing facility. Dinner meetings will not take place anywhere in the meantime.

Some Lions District meetings have been cancelled (including, later, the MD Convention); one school (so far) has cancelled their Gala which means our Hot Chips service there cannot take place; more may follow. Bunnings have vetoed Sausage Sizzles outside their stores & we have

yet to learn whether The Warehouse will follow suit. If that occurs it will mean the cancellation of our SS schedule outside The Botany Warehouse. We decided the planned 'Men's Health Seminar' should also be shelved.

The Water Safety Picnic was considered a first-class success, with particular thanks to Grant, Tony, Judith & Tina, and all Howick Lions who beavered away on the hot day.

A request for the Howick Lions Club to host a

DGs Cabinet Meeting (over three days) was declined - with thanks.

Lions Clubs International President Dr. Jung-Yul Choi comments on COVID - 19

Dear Lion,

The coronavirus (COVID-19) is changing the way we travel, congregate and serve in communities around the world. We care about every member, and the people we serve, which is why we all need to put health and

safety first in this challenging time for the world. We have received requests for suggestions on how to minimize the risk to Lions, clubs and communities when serving. Here are some recommendations on how you can keep yourself and your community healthy:

Consult local authorities and guidelines governing group events and large gatherings when considering Lions events.

Put health and safety first as you consider new meetings, projects and any other club activities.

Wash your hands frequently, avoid nonessential travel and crowds, especially if you live in an area where there's an outbreak.

Check the recommendations from health experts such as the World Health Organisation (WHO), the Centres for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) or your local government for any new updates, since this remains an evolving situation.

For questions regarding your district (single, sub- and multiple) conventions, please contact your district leadership for guidance. Remember, individuals over 60 and those with serious chronic medical conditions are at a higher risk of getting very sick from this illness.

A comprehensive list of ways to protect yourself and your club can be found on the WHO website.

Lions have served for more than one hundred years. We have been there for our communities during countless challenges to the world. Let's consider ways we can safely help, such as providing meals to low-income students whose schools are closing due to the virus. Let's check in on family, friends and neighbours. Let's continue to put our kindness in action while keeping health and safety in mind.

Now more than ever, it is important that we stand together as local communities, as a global community, and as Lions. Thank you for serving your community and the world.

in Lloyd Elsmore Park. Sir Barry unveiled a plaque on the wall of Whites Homestead (now the visitors centre & café) to commemorate this anniversary event.

Alan La Roche explained how the Howick Colonial Village had progressed from its beginnings to its current well-known situation today,

and how the many cottages were obtained and moved from different sites within the eastern area of Auckland.

This plaque commonrates the 4th Anniversary of the opening of the Howisel, Historical Willage on Bib March 1988.

This celebration will be followed by a VIP event on March 15 at the village when local MP's and other dignitaries will mark the occasion to further commemorate the 40th year of our renowned living museum.
