Metlifecare RV has cancelled all open days at its villages, suspended personal access to its in-house communal facilities and is restricting visits of external groups, until a Government alert review; (tradies & gardeners, observing health & safety protocols, excepted). The Howick Lions Club awaits advice from DMG with respect to resuming club meetings there.

The current policy for The Lions Club of Howick to continue to serve the community and maintain member liaison is as follows: -'No formal, physical club meetings will take place until the COVID-19 virus status allows it. Current Howick Lions Club communications between members should be conducted via remote electronic devices; and always observing advised social separation.'

The coronavirus (COVID-19) is creating challenges for one of our most traditional membership experiences - the club meeting. Although many clubs are unable to meet in person due to social distancing, it is not preventing Lions from gathering safely.

The scenario then moved to President Paul asking members to prepare for a 'video meeting' using a PC App called 'ZOOM'. Paul made the point that this event wasn't to be a serious session, but a fun catch-up for half an hour & a test to see if it could be a useful tool to progress our Lions service efforts under the severe Lockdown conditions. Agreed. So, on April Fools Day 2020 The Lions Club of Howick gathered together in cyberspace for a monthly 'Dinner Meeting': (Actually, President Paul 'cordially invited Howick Lions to a virtual BYO drinks event with fellow members at 6:30pm on Wednesday evening"). A requirement to participate was for each Lion to have a webcam with mic installed on their home computer; not all managed to do this in the time & under the Lockdown retail status, but a mobile phone App was available to enable



some folks to work around this proviso.
From the 6:30pm start fourteen Howick Lions gradually logged on to form a genial forum which became lively & excited as the concept took hold. (As the forum host/moderator President Paul had a hard time 'keeping the peace'). This trial was considered a super success and no doubt will be repeated.

7pm on a drizzly Autumn evening to log on to Zoom


to take part in a second 'face-to-face, socially-separated',



District Governors


District Governors are a key part of the New Voices initiative, as it is up to them to select and nominate four New Voices in their district.


