Secretary Alan exhibited his masterful selling technique and sold 16 calendars.









Local Clubs Gather for our DG



Sympathy was expressed for Karen; her mother passed on October 18.





In our club's 58 years since we were chartered, Howick Lions have been privileged to serve our community with many differing and interesting projects. Over these years we have also enjoyed supporting and working with some wonderful local people. One such person is Alan La Roche, founding member of the Howick Historical

Village, awarded an MBE in 1982, and appointed Howick Historian by the Manukau City Council in 2007.

Alan La Roche developed his interest in history, especially museums, from the age of 10, and to this day Alan has his own archive of items and articles dating back over 50 years.

Alan began his historical revival work in 1968, and support from Howick Lions started when Alan was working on All Saints Church, Shamrock Cottage and the Methodist Church, (when it was originally situated on the Pakuranga Highway).

Under Alan's supervision, projects like these endure, with Howick Lions tending to structure

maintenance and painting, helping to continue developing the Howick Historical Village into the renowned living museum we know today.

Alan's library of local history, where he can turn everyday items and facts into real and interesting stories, has become a


